FEAST OF THE GLORIOUS EPIPHANY



THE FEAST OF EPIPHANY

On the 6th of January Eastern Orthodox, Maronite... and Western Christians Catholics and non- Catholics celebrate the great Feast of Epiphany. This Feast is a celebration that goes right back to the beginning of Christianity and opens up the meaning of the Christian faith and tradition. Epiphany originally comes (from the Greek Epiphaneia, and the syriac word Denho) which means the "manifestation from above,"

of the mystery of God, that we call the "divine revelation." The Feast of Epiphany primarily involves the manifestation of God in Christ, Christ being manifested as the Son of God and God as a Trinity Father, Son and Holy Spirit and it manifested at once at the Jordan River.

The Eastern Epiphany celebrates the Baptism of Christ in the Jordan River by John the Baptist, as the event of the manifestation of Christ as the Son of God and the manifestation of God in Trinity, and also as the event that marks the beginning of Christ's mission. This saving particularly revealed in the service of the Great Sanctification of the water.

While the Western Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of the new baby born who is King and God's son, to the three wise Oriental Magi that marks the manifestation of the divinity of Christ to the "nations." So from that we understand that, Epiphany in the western Church, is primarily the manifestation of the divine Savior, who is Christ and

Messiah to the gentiles; but it is also the acknowledgment of Christ by the gentiles. This double meaning is expressed by the way the Western Church interpreted the offering of gold, frankincense and myrrh, by the wise Magi. On

the one hand, it saw these gifts as symbols of the three aspects of Christ's life, his being king, priest and prophet. On the other hand it re-enacted the offering in various ways by instituting appropriate acts of offering, to the poor, to the church and to the sick.

This diversity between the East and the West raises a number of questions, both historical and theological, to which liturgists have provided various answers. Above all it raises the question whether implies it any contradiction or not? I believe that there is no contradiction, because both celebrations lead to the same divine truth: the divine manifestation of Christ as the Son God and the divine manifestation of the One God in Trinity. On the other hand, it must be said that, the Eastern tradition links Epiphany to Christ's saving mission and looks to Paschal and Pentecost as its final and saving outcome. The Western tradition links Epiphany to the earthly life of Christ and looks to his mission as a gradual disclosure of Christ's saving person.

According to **Scholars** celebrate Epiphany on the 6th of January because due to the old Egyptian calendar the 6th of January was the day of the winter solstice, (which means when the sun reaches its highest) a major day of religious celebration for pagans. Some pagans (especially the Egyptians) celebrated on this day the conquest of winter darkness by the invincible god-Others sun. celebrated appearance and glorification of god-emperor in a city the (especially the Romans).

Christians, who acknowledged Christ "the sun as righteousness" (Mal. 4:2) and the "light of the world" (John 1:9 and 8:12), replaced the worship of the god-sun and pagan the glorification of the god-emperor by the worship of Christ. Later on the new Roman calendar placed the winter solstice on the 25th of December and provided the occasion for another pagan celebration. Christians found the occasion to introduce a new Feast, Christmas, commemorating the birth of Christ, who is Emmanuel, God with us and the sun of righteousness that God sent into the world.


