# SUNDAY OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

#### I BELIEVE IN LIFE EVERLASTING"

This Sunday reading exposes us on life and death. As Christians what do we think of life after death? Historically most religion believes in life after death, the Egyptians had used the mummification for the bodies of their dead and burry with them some food and money believing that they will come back to life. Buddhists believe death is a natural part of the life cycle. They believe that death simply leads to rebirth. This belief in reincarnation – that a person's spirit remains close by and seeks out a new body and new life – is a comforting and important principle.

All life is in a cycle of death and rebirth called samsara. When someone dies their energy passes into another form. The Buddhist believes also in karma or 'intentional action'. Through good actions, such as ethical conduct, and by developing concentration and wisdom, Buddhists hope to either gain enlightenment or to ensure a better future for themselves. These good actions are set out in the Eightfold Path, which includes right speech, right livelihood. and right concentration. Good actions will result in a better rebirth, while bad actions will have the opposite effect. Depending on the actions performed in previous lives, rebirth could be as a human or animal or even ghosts, demi-gods, or gods. Being born as a

human is seen by Buddhists as a rare opportunity to work towards escaping this cycle of samsara. The escape from Nirvana samsara is called or enlightenment. Once Nirvana is achieved. and the enlightened individual physically dies, Buddhists believe that they will no longer be reborn. But Buddhist doesn't believe in souls or an eternal creator God because of two words: Anicca -Buddhists believe that nothing is permanent. Everything changes. So, this means that things like everlasting souls or eternal gods cannot exist. Buddhism, unlike other religions, does not believe in a creator God or an eternal or everlasting soul. Anatta -Buddhists believe that there is no permanent self or soul. Because there is no unchanging permanent essence or soul, Buddhists sometimes talk about energy being reborn, rather than souls. Buddhists believe in life after death because the Buddha taught that human beings are each born an infinite number of times, unless they achieve Nirvana.

However, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that the Christian believe in the eternal life that is based on the life with Christ. If we live with Him, we will die with Him. Life with Christ and death with Christ is the most important step towards the entrance into everlasting life. Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts speak of a final destiny of the soul a destiny which can be different for

Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven-through purification or immediately, or immediate and everlasting damnation. at the evening of life, we shall be judged on our love. Either we go to Heaven or to Purgatory or to Hell.

Those who will go to Heaven are those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God for ever, for they "see him as he is," face to face: They are those who had a perfect life with the Most Holy Trinity - This communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed - is called "heaven." Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness. They are also those who knew that to live in heaven is "to be with Christ." The elect live "in Christ Jesus who by his death and Resurrection has "opened" heaven to us. While those who will go to Purgatory are those who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. This teaching is based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead that they might be delivered from their sin." Hell is a state of life, a free choice we took during our life on earth where we couldn't show love to God, but we insist on living in sin and doing grave sin against God, against our neighbor or against ourselves: "He who does not love remains in death. Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no

murderer has eternal life abiding in him." Our Lord warns us that we shall be separated from him if we fail to meet the serious needs of the poor and the little ones who are his brethren. to die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called "hell." Jesus often speaks of "Gehenna" of "the unquenchable fire" reserved for those who to the end of their lives refuse to believe and be converted, where both soul and body can be lost. The teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity. Immediately after death the souls of those who die in a state of mortal sin descend into hell, where they suffer the punishments of hell, "eternal fire." Let us pray, Father, accept this offering from your whole family. Grant us your peace in this life, save us from final damnation, and count us among those you have chosen.
