HEALING OF THE HEMORRHAGING

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Today we are celebrating the third Sunday of Lent which is the Sunday of the haemorrhaging. This passage deals with two intertwined events. With one message from Jesus which is the importance of having faith. Two people in particular watched for his arrival.

The haemorrhaging woman lost her health, her wealth and had a chronic problem, embarrassing as well, she was ceremonially unclean under Leviticus law. She talked to herself, planning this all out. If she could just touch tassel of his garment she could be healed. Now this seems superstitious magic, she believed in his power, but avoided a personal contact with him. So, she crept up and touched him without his notice. She was granted the healing. Jesus knew who touched him and she knew she was healed. But He stopped and acted as though he didn't. At first, she denied it. Jesus persisted looking for a public confession. Finally she Came forward in fear and trembling and found there was no need to be afraid. Jesus said to her "Daughter, your faith made you well". It was not her touch, but her faith that healed her, it was not the

garment's intrinsic power, but the Lord! - His personal response to her "Go in peace" healed her soul as well. The woman's faith was strong but misdirected. She felt her needs were not worthy of His attention, but Jesus responded to her needs by healing, both of her Body and soul.

Jairus was a ruler of the Synagogue in Capernaum and was waiting anxiously the delay of Jesus caused by the woman. He had often, heard Jesus teaching, and likely had witnessed miracles, he came to Jesus saying; "Please come" His beloved 12-year-old daughter was very ill. Jairus' faith was hesitant, lacking in completeness. He underestimated the Lord and what he could do. He was going through religious motions but had no faith in them. His child who was clearly dead was well and walking.

Christ gives newness of life. Do we hesitate to think He cares, and that he will help us, if he is eager to offer us salvation and eternal life, do we think he doesn't care about our needs and concerns? What holds us back from the Saviour? Do we sincerely trust the Lord, do we have faith? He can be trusted, and He is quite capable. Do we feel too

small or insignificant? Jesus' love, expressed on the cross, says otherwise.

Jesus is calling us to trust and act upon the assurance of His love and forgiveness. Each time we become stronger, and ready for even greater challenges. Faith can move mountains, if it draws upon the love and power of the Saviour.


