Final Address of Pope Leo XIV at the Conclusion of His Pastoral Visit to Lebanon



Departing is often more difficult than arriving. We have spent time together, and in Lebanon, this spirit of encounter is contagious. Here, I have found that people enjoy coming together rather than being isolated. While arriving in your country meant gently entering into your culture. Leaving this land means carrying you in my heart. We are not leaving each other rather, having met, we will move forward together. We hope to involve the entire Middle East in this spirit of fraternity and commitment to peace, including those who currently consider themselves enemies.

I am grateful therefore for the days spent with you, and I am pleased that I could fulfill the desire of my beloved predecessor, Pope Francis, who would have loved to be here.

I prayed at the tomb of St Charbel, who is loved by Christians and Muslims alike, and sense the profound spiritual roots of this country, your history is a valuable source of nourishment that can sustain you on the difficult journey towards the future.



I was deeply moved by my brief visit to the port of Beirut, where an explosion devastated the area, not to mention many lives. I prayed for all the victims and I carry with me the pain and the thirst for truth and justice so many families of an entire country.

In these few days, I have met many people and shaken many hands, receiving a sense of hope from these encounters. You are strong as the cedars that populate your beautiful mountains, as beautiful as the olive trees that grow in the plains in the south and near the sea. In this regard, I greet all the regions of Lebanon that I was unable to visit, Tripoli and the North, the Becca and the south of the country, Tyro, Sidone, biblical places, all of the areas, especially in the south, that are currently experiencing a state of conflict and uncertainty.

And embracing all of you, I express my aspiration for peace, along with a heartfelt appeal, may the attacks and hostilities cease. We must recognize that armed struggle brings no benefit while weapons are lethal, negotiation, mediation and dialog are constructive. Let us all choose peace as a way and not just as a goal.

Let us remember what St John called the second reaffirmed while in your midst, "Lebanon is more than a country; it is a message."

Let us learn to work together and hope together, so that this may indeed become a reality. May God bless the Lebanese people, all of you, the Middle East and all humanity.

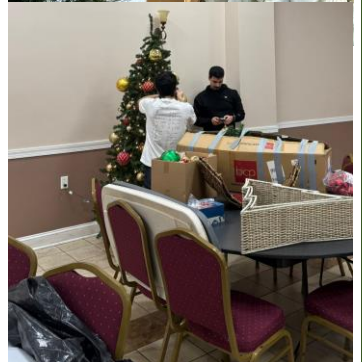

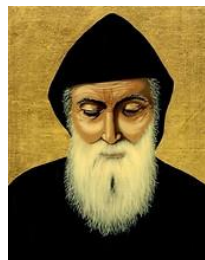

Sunday, December 7, 2025 – First Reading – Galatians 4:21 - 5:1

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians. Your blessing father...

Brothers and Sisters:

Tell me, you who desire to be subject to the law, will you not listen to the law? For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave woman and the other by a free woman. One, the child of the slave, was born according to the flesh; the other, the child of the free woman, was born through the promise. Now this is an allegory: these women are two covenants. One woman, in fact, is Hagar, from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery. Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia and corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. But the other woman corresponds to the Jerusalem above; she is free, and she is our mother. For it is written, 'Rejoice, you childless one, you who bear no children, burst into song and shout, you who endure no birth pangs; for the children of the desolate woman are more numerous than the children of the one who is married.' Now you, my friends, are children of the promise, like Isaac. But just as at that time the child who was born according to the flesh persecuted the child who was born according to the Spirit, so it is now also. But what does the scripture say? 'Drive out the slave and her child; for the child of the slave will not share the inheritance with the child of the free woman.' So then, friends, we are children, not of the slave but of the free woman. For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

قُولُوا لِي، أَنْتُمْ الَّذِينَ تُرِيدُونَ أَنْ تَكُونُوا فِي حُكْمِ الشَّرِيعَةِ، أَمَا تَسْمَعُونَ الشَّرِيعَةَ؟ فَإِنَّهُ مَكْتُوبٌ: كَانَ لِإِبْرَاهِيمَ ابْنَانِ، وَاحِدٌ مِنَ الْجَارِيَةِ، وَوَاحِدٌ مِنَ الْحُرَّةِ. أَمَا الَّذِي مِنَ الْجَارِيَةِ فَقَدْ وُلِدَ بِحَسَبِ الْجَسَدِ، وَأَمَا الَّذِي مِنَ الْحُرَّةِ فَبِقُوَّةِ الْوَعْدِ. وَفِي ذَلِكَ رَمَزٌ: فَسَارَةُ وَهَاجِرُ تُمَثِّلَانِ عَهْدَيْنِ، عَهْدًا مِنْ جَبَلِ سَيْنَاءِ يُلِدُ لِلْعُبُودِيَّةِ، وَهُوَ هَاجِرٌ؛ لِأَنَّ هَاجَرَ هِيَ جَبَلُ سَيْنَاءِ الَّذِي فِي بِلَادِ الْعَرَبِ، وَتُؤَافِقُ أُورُشَلِيمَ الْحَالِيَّةَ، لِأَنَّهَا فِي الْعُبُودِيَّةِ هِيَ وَأَوْلَادُهَا. أَمَا أُورُشَلِيمُ الْعُلْيَا فَهِيَ حُرَّةٌ، وَهِيَ أُمًّا؛ لِأَنَّهُ مَكْتُوبٌ: «إِفْرَحِي، أَيَّتُهَا الْعَاقِرُ الَّتِي لَمْ تَلِدْ؛ إِنْدَفِعِي بِالْتَرَنِيمِ وَاصْرُخِي، أَيَّتُهَا الَّتِي لَمْ تَتَمَخَّضْ؛ لِأَنَّ أَوْلَادَ الْمَهْجُورَةِ أَكْثَرُ مِنْ أَوْلَادِ الْمُتَزَوِّجَةِ». أَمَا أَنْتُمْ، أَيُّهَا الْإِخْوَةَ، فَإِنَّكُمْ أَوْلَادُ الْوَعْدِ مِثْلُ إِسْحَاقِ. وَلَكِنْ، كَمَا كَانَ حِينَئِذٍ الْمَوْلُودُ بِحَسَبِ الْجَسَدِ يَضْطَهُدُ الْمَوْلُودَ بِحَسَبِ الرُّوحِ، فَكَذَلِكَ الْآنَ أَيْضًا. وَلَكِنْ مَاذَا يَقُولُ الْكِتَابُ؟ «أَطْرُدِ الْجَارِيَةَ وَأَبْنَاهَا، لِأَنَّ ابْنَ الْجَارِيَةِ لَا يَرِثُ مَعَ ابْنِ الْحُرَّةِ». إِذَا، أَيُّهَا الْإِخْوَةَ، لَسْنَا أَوْلَادَ جَارِيَةٍ، بَلْ أَوْلَادُ الْحُرَّةِ. إِنَّ الْمَسِيحَ قَدْ حَرَّرَنَا لِتَنْبَغِي أَحْرَارًا. فَانْتَبِهُوا إِذَا وَلَا تَعُودُوا تَخْضَعُونَ لِغَبْدِيَّةٍ.

Sunday, December 7, 2025 – Gospel Reading - Luke 1:57-66

The Apostle Writes:

Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. But his mother said, 'No; he is to be called John.' They said to her, 'None of your relatives has this name.' Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. He asked for a writing-tablet and wrote, 'His name is John.' And all of them were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. All who heard them pondered them and said, 'What then will this child become?' For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him.

This is the truth. Peace be with you.
