


United States Catholic Bishops' Worldwide Charities

(This collection combines the four USCCB collections: Central and Eastern Europe, the Church in Latin America, the Church in Africa, and Catholic Relief Services. The total is divided accordingly.)

Lent: February 16-April 3:

Eparchial Charities Appeal

April 3: Good Friday

Holy Land Collection

(Part of this collection is sent through the USCCB to the Holy Land and another part is sent directly to the Maronite Eparchy of Haifa.)

April 5: Easter Sunday

Pastor's Collection

(This second collection is an Easter gift for the Pastor's personal use.)

May 3: Our Lady of Lebanon

National Shrine of Our Lady of Lebanon

(All funds collected are sent from the Chancery directly to our Shrine in North Jackson, Ohio.)

May 17:

Catholic Home Missions Appeal (This collection is used for Missions in the USA. Our Eparchy has received grants from the USCCB from this collection for several years.)

May 31:

Catholic Communications Campaign

(Following the norms established by the USCCB, 50% of this collection is sent to them for national Catholic television, radio and other media, and 50% is retained by our Eparchy for the Maronite Voice and any other communication needs we may have.)

June 28: Sts. Peter & Paul

Holy Father's Collection (Peter's Pence)

(The entire collection is sent to the Holy Father to assist him with emergency financial assistance to aid the neediest throughout the world.)

September 6:

Catholic University of America and Maronite Seminary

(25% of this collection is for funding for academic scholarships at CUA, and 75% is for Our Lady of Lebanon Maronite Seminary in Washington, DC.)

October 18:

World Mission Sunday

(As per the norms established by the USCCB, 91% of this collection goes to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, and 9% to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association [CNEWA].)

November 8:

Maronite Patriarchal Charities

(All Proceeds from this collection are sent directly to our Patriarch for his charitable works.)

December 25: Christmas

Pastor's Collection

(This second collection is a Christmas gift for the Pastor's personal use.)

Second Collections should be submitted to the Chancery within 2 weeks of the Collection

(except for the Christmas and Easter second collections which are for the Pastor).

Assessments are divided into 10 segments to be paid at the beginning of each month from February through November (inclusive).

Dear Reverend Tabchi:

Each year after going over the Annual Financial Report, the Eparchial Compliance Officer Anthony Budway, with Bishop Gregory and myself, reassess the Annual Assessment and the Bishop's Appeal.

In determining the new assessment, each Parish/Mission's Net Profit or Loss as recorded on its 2025 Profit and Loss Statement as well as the Cash and Cash Equivalents as reported on its Balance Sheet, was considered.

In addition, the following factors were taken into consideration: 1) Missions need to be given special consideration. 2) Parishes with major projects which have been approved by the Bishop, or those that have large mortgages with relatively little savings in the bank, were given special consideration.

In light of the above, the 2026 Eparchial Assessment for Saint Maron Church will be **\$9400.00**. As usual, this amount will be broken up into ten payments for which the Chancery will email you an invoice from February to November.

The 2026 Bishop's Appeal assessment for our parish will be **\$3,500.00**. This appeal is to be made during Lent and the total amount is due at the Chancery after Easter.

First Reading - Hebrews 7:11-19

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. Your blessing father...

Brothers and Sisters:

If perfection had been attainable through the Levitical priesthood for the people received the law under this priesthood what further need would there have been to speak of another priest arising according to the order of Melchizedek, rather than one according to the order of Aaron? For when there is a change in the priesthood, there is necessarily a change in the law as well. Now the one of whom these things are spoken belonged to another tribe, from which no one has ever served at the altar. For it is evident that our Lord was descended from Judah, and in connection with that tribe Moses said nothing about priests. It is even more obvious when another priest arises, resembling Melchizedek, one who has become a priest, not through a legal requirement concerning physical descent, but through the power of an indestructible life. For it is attested of him, 'You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek.' There is, on the one hand, the abrogation of an earlier commandment because it was weak and ineffectual (for the law made nothing perfect); there is, on the other hand, the introduction of a better hope, through which we approach God.

يا إخوتي، لو كان الكمال قد تحقق بالكهنوت اللاوي، وهو أساس الشريعة التي أعطيت للشعب، فأي حاجة بعد إلى أن يقول كاهن آخر على «رتبة ملكيصادق»، ولا يقال «على رتبة هارون»؟ فمتي تغير الكهنوت، لا بد من تغيير الشريعة أيضاً. فالذى يقال هذا في شأنه، أي المسيح، جاء من سبط آخر، لم يلزمه أحد منه خدمة المتذبح، ومن الواضح أن ربنا أشرق من يهودا، من سبط لم يصفه موسى بشيء من الكهنوت. ويزيد الأمروضوحاً أن الكاهن الآخر الذي يقول على مثال ملكيصادق، لم يقم وفق شريعة وصييّة بشرى، بل وفق قوّة حيّة لا تزول. ويشهد له: «أنت كاهن إلى الأبد، على رتبة ملكيصادق!». وهكذا يتم إبطال وصييّة الكهنوت السابقة، بسبب صعفها وعدم نفعها، لأن الشريعة لم تبلغ شيئاً إلى الكمال، ويتم أيضاً إدخال رجاء أفضل، به تقترب من الله.

Gospel Reading - Saint Luke 2:41-52

The Apostle Writes:

Every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor.
